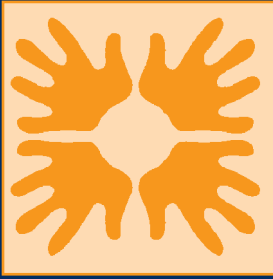

WHAT IS THERAPLAY®?

Theraplay® is a short-term, therapist-guided play therapy for children and their parents/caregivers that:

- Enhances attachment, self-esteem and trust in others through joyful engagement
- Is based on the natural patterns of healthy interaction between parent and child
- Focuses on four essential qualities found in parent-child relationships: Structure, Nurture, Engagement and Challenge
- Creates an active and empathic connection between child and parents
- Results in a changed view of the self as worthy and lovable, and of relationships as positive and rewarding

WHAT IS THE MARSCHAK INTERACTION METHOD?

The MIM is a structured technique for observing and assessing the interaction between caregivers and child. The MIM:

- Consists of a series of simple tasks which the caregivers and child perform together
- Is used to evaluate the caregivers' capacity for Structure, Nurture, Engagement and Challenge and the child's response to the caregivers
- Is a valuable tool in planning treatment and determining how to help families strengthen their relationships

WHAT IS GROUP THERAPLAY®?

Group Theraplay® is an adaptation of Theraplay to settings in which the therapist or other professional works with groups of children or with groups of parents and children. It is:

- A play group structured by adult leaders
- Cooperative and nurturing activities that lead to increased self-esteem, a sense of belonging, trust and social growth
- Used in classrooms, clinical and residential settings

SPECIAL FEATURES

Theraplay Institute training:

- Is intensive, active and rewarding

- Features a high ratio of professionally trained leaders to number of participants
- Includes videos of treatment with a variety of clients

Theraplay and the Marschak Interaction Method are combined in this four-day intensive training. This training is designed to teach you how to:

- Administer the MIM and analyze it at a beginning level
- Conduct feedback sessions with parents based upon the MIM analysis
- Use the MIM as a guideline for Theraplay treatment planning
- Differentiate and use the four Theraplay dimensions: Structure, Nurture, Engagement and Challenge
- Describe the relationship of Theraplay to current attachment and brain research
- Describe how Theraplay is applied to meet the needs of children with behavior problems, foster and adopted children, children with autism/PDD, older children and children suffering from trauma
- Work with parents to observe their children more empathically and participate in treatment sessions aimed at fostering better parent-child attachment

LEVEL TWO THERAPLAY & MIM

Prerequisite: Level One Theraplay & MIM
Required for Theraplay certification

Level Two training is a total of three days. If you have already attended the fifth-day module on Trauma offered at Level One training, you may register for days one and two only. Topics covered will be *MIM Skill Development* and *Working with Parents*. The fee is \$325 for members and \$350 for non-members.

Registrants should be using Theraplay in their work for three months prior to attending this training. Some registrants may present a case for practicum credit, but making a presentation is not required.

- Improve your skills in working with parents in Theraplay
- Use a wider range of Theraplay activities and techniques
- Apply the Theraplay dimensions to additional populations and settings
- Adapt Theraplay for traumatized children
- Administer and analyze the MIM at an intermediate skill level
- Adapt Theraplay for working with older children and children with autism



ADVANCED PRACTICE

Prerequisite: Level Two Theraplay & MIM

Fee: \$295 non-members

CE credits: 12

This is a two-day group supervision focused on advanced Theraplay and MIM practice and research. Participants will present videotaped segments of their Theraplay work to the group for feedback and supervision. This training is designed to help you:

- Develop skills in scoring, analysis and use of the MIM for treatment planning to an advanced level
- Apply Theraplay to more challenging settings and populations
- Present Theraplay to relevant audiences
- Describe the latest developments in research and theory that impact the Theraplay model.

In addition to CE credits, participants may earn up to 5 supervisory hours toward Theraplay therapist certification (applies to one Advanced Practice; attendance at subsequent Advanced Practice will earn CE credits only.)

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Payment:
